Co-founded in August of 2022 by Murry Burgess (CEO) and Lauren D. Pharr (CFO), Field Inclusive strives to provide tangible and actionable improvements in the natural sciences by addressing social field safety issues related to equity, diversity, and inclusion, and accessibility. We seek to support all field biologists in the natural sciences, and all those working and recreating in the outdoors through identifying and addressing field safety issues, developing field safety resources, and supporting marginalized researchers through financial aid and experiential learning opportunities.

We envision a world in which the outdoors feels safe and welcoming, regardless of personal identity such as, but not limited to: race, ethnicity, gender identity, sexual orientation, ability, or religion. We believe all field researchers deserve and have a right to the tools necessary for success in their professional work.

Field Inclusive would not be able to host our events, or offer financial opportunities to marginalized and historically excluded individuals without the generous donations we receive from individuals, as well as the sponsorships and partnerships from organizations and institutions. We hope to continue to offer new opportunities and experiences for marginalized and historically excluded individuals. We will continue to provide research grants and travel awards and to host public events that bring awareness, information, and a fun community environment!

The Frontiers in Ornithology Association aims to educate and inspire youth to take their passion for birds to a higher level by encouraging opportunities in ornithology, conservation science, and related academic and professional pursuits. All attendees of the symposium were given one ticket to vote for one of three programs. The programs were selected by the Frontiers Team based on their benefit to youth through education, research, or conservation activities. Each program received a portion of the Fund based on the final vote by attendees based on a ratio. FI was one of those three organizations, being awarded **\$300**.

The <u>College of Natural Resources</u> at NC State University believes that hands-on, in-the-field experiences are core to the education of students. For many of our undergraduate and graduate students, this experience includes conducting fieldwork and research outdoors in our natural environments, often in remote areas. While hard hats, safety vests, and protective gear are provided to keep our students physically safe, many students, particularly those from underrepresented and marginalized groups, often require identification affiliating them with the university to further ensure safety. This initiative was an NC State crowdfunding project created by several students to support the College of Natural Resources. Murry Burgess and Lauren D. Pharr, who helped lead this initiative, also founded the nonprofit Field Inclusive, Inc, which strives to provide actionable improvements in the natural resources industry by addressing social field safety issues related to justice, equity, diversity and inclusion.
