In 2022, we had the idea to start a nonprofit in support of marginalized field researchers in the natural sciences. Fast forward to 2024, and we have accomplished so much more than we could have imagined!

This year, we continued to provide awareness and safety resources addressing the unique issues faced by BIPOC, LGBTQIA+, disabled, and other underrepresented scientists in the field. We hosted webinars, virtual and in-person workshops, and participated in roundtable discussions surrounding field safety issues. We continued to develop and update free online resources. Most excitingly, we began development of our online field safety training course!

We also welcomed aboard four new board members and continued with celebrations of our amazing community! We hosted our 2nd #FieldInclusiveWeek, where we highlighted the awesome careers of marginalized researchers. We were proud to be able to compensate all of our event speakers. In addition, we were able to financially support 7 marginalized students with research grants, travel awards, and fellowships to support paid learning opportunities.

We envision a world in which the outdoors feels safe and welcoming for all, regardless of personal identity. With your continued support, we look forward to accomplishing even more next year!

Finally, we finished the week with #FieldHistory, where we discussed the history of black and women field researchers.






Killian Yevtyeyev

Field Inclusive's major focus for 2025 is continuing to expand our internal leadership and team capacity. We are hoping to expand our Board and create dedicated committees for our services, such as a Workshop Committee, Birding Program Leaders, and International Student Support. We are also seeking grants and funding to create paid positions within our organization. Additionally, we plan to expand our volunteer network and social opportunities.

Another goal for 2025 is to continue to update our workshop materials and training offerings. We've received valuable feedback from our first year of workshops, and we are dedicated to improving content and resources to best equip workshop participants.

We also anticipate our online field safety course to be near-completion in 2025! This official training will be readily available for anyone who works professionally outdoors and will include modules such as identifying potential field safety risks, communicating those risks, and steps to mitigation on individual, supervisory, and institutional levels.

Finally, Field Inclusive will continue to seek more partnerships with nature and wildlife organizations to provide experiential learning fellowships for marginalized students. We will continue to provide research grants and travel awards and to host public events that bring awareness, information, and a fun community environment!
